


*How to Fix (Unf*ck) A Country* by Roy Havemann 9781776193417 | Jonathan Ball Publishers | TPB | R310

Hers becomes a life of firsts. She is the first person in her family to travel overseas. The first to graduate from university. It is also her first love, with his infectious smile that infected her with HIV. This diagnosis throws her life into disarray. Fearing stigma and feeling the need to maintain her "good girl" image, she kept her status a secret. However, she soon succumbed to depression. It is in the aftermath, when she picks up the broken pieces of her life that she finds purpose in all the pain she has endured.




Hunting The Seven by Beverley Roos-Muller 9781776193509 | Jonathan Ball Publishers | TPB | R320

Yet their real agenda remained a mystery. Beverley Roos-Muller reveals her own decades-long connection to the case and her search for the truth of their deaths that has been shrouded in lies and mystery.





Author Gary Ralfe has a long and storied connection with Michaelhouse, as an Old Boy, grandparent, governor, chairman, trustee and benefactor. He draws on archival sources, interviews and extensive research to tell this complex and fascinating story.

Tensions are high and the smallest disturbance in the status quo could set the world on fire. And a signal flickering through deep space could be just that spark.


