
But the mission takes Shepherd away from an investigation in a high security prison that is about to explode into violence.

He imagines messages, sent to us from beyond the end, from those who saw it coming from Africa, Europe, the Americas and the rest of the world, exhorting us to change now.





Placing us in the capable hands of journalist Alec. Z. Carelli, Clark allows him to construct what he claims is the 'definitive account' of the murder and what led up to it. Built on hours of interviews with witnesses and family members, painstaking historical research, and most notably, correspondence with the killers themselves, the result is a riveting snapshot of lives rocked by tragedy, and a town left in turmoil. The only question is: how much of it is true?




In Such Tremendous Heat by Kehinde Fadipe 9780349703206 | Little Brown | TPB | R390



While Alif is leading a school trip, a Hindu student goads him about being Muslim, enraged, Alif twists his ear. Fired from his job, Alif's life descends into chaos. Meanwhile, his home city darkens under the spreading shadow of violence.
