
Serpent & Dove 3: Gods & Monsters by Shelby Mahurin


Dr. Seuss's Sleep Book by Dr. Seuss


The Caravan at the Edge of Doom 2: Foul Prophecy by Jim Beckett


The Last Bear by Hannah Gold






Nancy Drew Diaries 23: Blue Lady of Coffin Hall by Carolyn Keene






