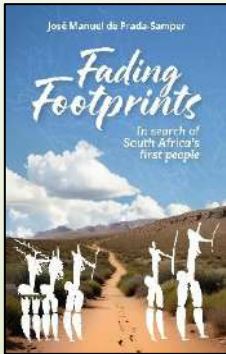

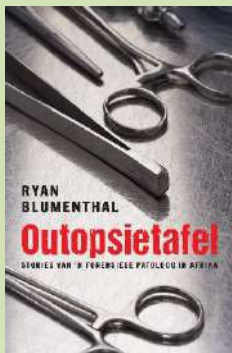
Fading Footprints by José Manuel de Prada-Samper

Part historical detective story, part memoir, *Fading Footprints* traces the author's journey into the magical folklore of the /xam hunter-gatherers of the Upper Karoo. Through archival research and on field trips in South Africa, De Prada-Samper reveals the tragic scope of the genocide of the /xam San by European colonisers. However, he is also able to humanise the /xam as he delves into the work of two Victorian researchers, who recorded the stories of San prisoners in Cape Town over more than a decade in the late 1800s. In seeking out the ancient folklore tales, the author learns that many are still told to this day by farm workers in forgotten corners of the Northern Cape and that, contrary to common belief, the culture and traditions of South Africa's first people are still alive. Their footprints have not been erased.

It's the height of World War II and the fate of the world hangs in the balance. Lieutenant Jack Pembroke is ordered to join a convoy and sail his beloved ship, HMSAS Gannet, from South Africa to Egypt, where he will join the coastal escorts. With the Mediterranean all but closed to maritime traffic and Rommel's forces rampaging across North Africa, it seems unlikely Gannet will survive. Jack finds passionate romance with a Spanish beauty in exotic Alexandria but is soon thrust into battle while escorting ships running supplies to the beleaguered town of Tobruk, home of the Second South African Infantry Division. With the pressure building and ships around him being sunk by enemy bombers, Jack must deal with his own trauma while leading his men to safety. It all comes to a head when Tobruk is surrounded, about to fall to Axis forces, with Gannet still trapped in the port.



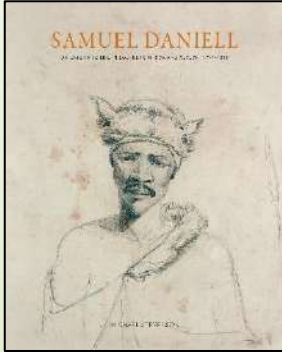
Outopsietafel deur Ryan Blumenthal

Hy het gedurende sy loopbaan byvoorbeeld al etlike hoëprofielsterftes hanteer, sterftes weens natuurrampe en ook mense wat deur weerlig of wilde diere gedood is. Blumenthal bied 'n fassinerende blik op alles wat agter die skerms gebeur by die lykshuis en beskryf selfs 'n tipiese lykskouing en die instrumente wat hy tydens 'n ondersoek gebruik. Hy deel ook 'n paar geheime, soos hoe om vas te stel of 'n moord plaasgevind het en of iemand selfdood gepleeg het. Al kan die dooies nie praat nie, het hulle nogtans baie om te sê, en Blumenthal is daar om te luister.

Samuel Daniell by Michael Stevenson

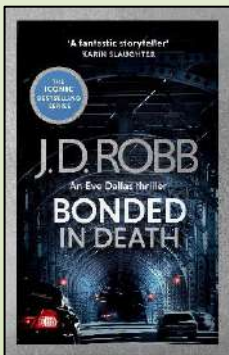
Samuel Daniell is the first biography of the life and work of one of the most accomplished, yet least-known artists from the era of British exploration. Daniell travelled around southern Africa between 1800 and 1803 and lived in Ceylon until his death in 1811 at a young age. While most sketches of this period served as informative notes for later prints and paintings, Daniell's vivid sketches, drawings and watercolours are individualized and accomplished art works. His representations of people of colour are remarkable for their perceptiveness and are perhaps unmatched in their sensitivity in the colonial era. Daniell also produced many drawings and paintings of the animals of southern Africa which are noteworthy for their accuracy. His massive folio *African Scenery and Animals* was one of the grandest books of the age of aquatint, and its prints are iconic in South African art history. His biography is a fascinating example of how art contributed to the accumulation of scientific knowledge and the extension of British imperial power. Daniell's drawings are widely scattered, and mostly unpublished. No letters or notebooks have survived.

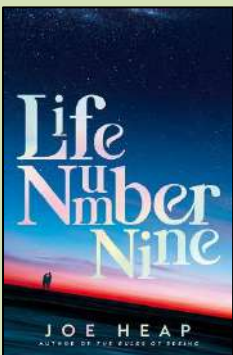
Dream Count by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie

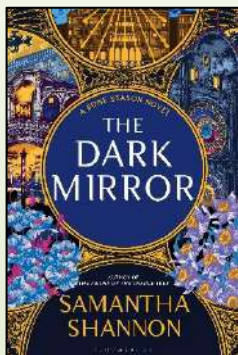

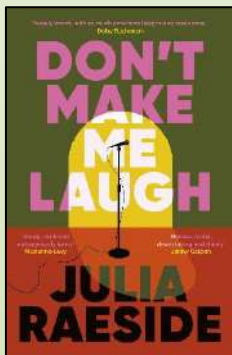

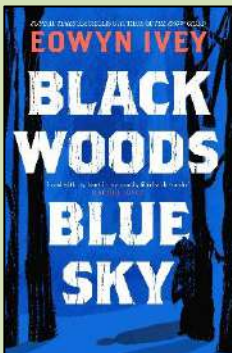


Don't Make Me Laugh by Julia Raeside

It is a story about power and control and manipulation, about gendered roles in both the workplace and our personal lives and about how women are set up in competition with each other.

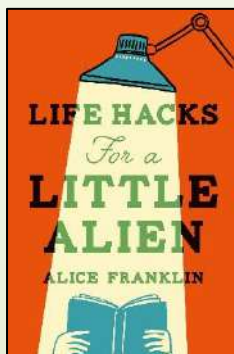

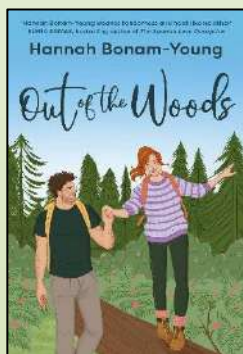

Her anxious mum and meticulous dad, while well-intentioned, are of little help.

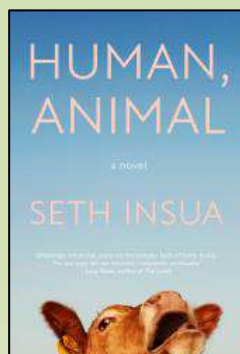

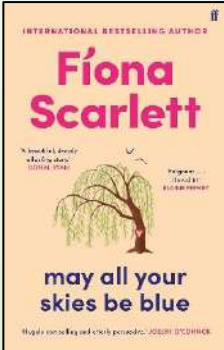
Human, Animal by Seth Insua

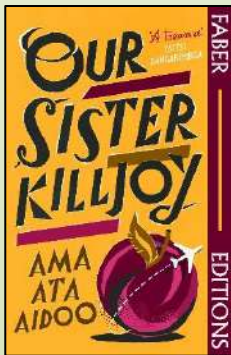

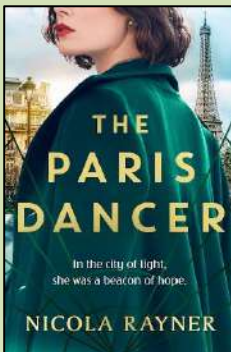
In Germany, as guest of honour over embassy cocktails, she cringes at her countrymen.

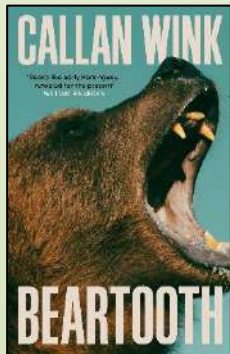

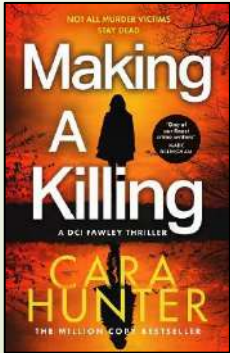


The Wardrobe Department by Elaine Garvey
